Superintendent's Letter

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Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students,

As we embrace the month of November, we want to take a moment to express our gratitude for your continued support and involvement in our school community. This month is filled with exciting events, important updates, and opportunities for us to come together as a community.

Priority Area 1: Teaching and Learning Updates

National Resources

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) released the Anonymized Threat Response Guidance: A Toolkit for K-12 Schools, a new resource to help K-12 schools and their law enforcement and community partners create tailored approaches to addressing anonymous threats of violence, including those received on social media. The toolkit outlines steps school leaders can take to assess and respond to anonymous threats, better prepare for and prevent future threats, and work in coordination with law enforcement and other local partners when threats arise. It is co-sealed with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), which provided expert feedback on the toolkit's key principles and strategies.

The toolkit emphasizes six key strategies for schools to consider when addressing anonymous threats:

Build awareness about reporting to detect threats early and deter future threats.

Develop a partnership structure that will help address threats. This includes school administrators, law enforcement personnel and mental health professionals.

Engage law enforcement to manage threat situations and decide when to scale response actions up or down.

Balance initial response steps to ensure the campus is safe. Most critically, treat each threat as credible, and from there, work with necessary partners to determine how to approach an immediate response.

Tap into multidisciplinary threat assessment teams, when appropriate, to support interventions and expedite response if the subject who made the threat becomes known.

Take steps throughout the school year to prepare for threats. Establish a response protocol and practice other types of emergency management activities, such as training exercises for staff.

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Missouri-Specific Resources

C2R would like to remind LEAs and families of the importance of reporting threats and not reposting or sharing threats on social media. If you become aware of any social media threat, please report it to Courage2Report and your local law enforcement. Reporting allows C2R staff to see the trends occurring in the state and the country. As a reminder, treat all threats as real until they are fully investigated and vetted.

Mental Health Resources

The Missouri Department of Mental Health (DMH) has a number of violence-related resources available to families and school leaders on the <u>DMH website here</u>. The National Association of School Psychologists has additional resources for parents and educators for <u>supporting students experiencing childhood trauma</u>. The <u>988</u> <u>Suicide and Crisis Lifeline</u> is also a source of support available 24/7 to people in crisis, including people experiencing challenging reactions to disasters or threats.

Priority Area 2: Collaborative Culture and Staffing Updates

Recommendations to Parents/Guardians

How to receive inclement weather notifications via Infinite Campus

- To be notified of school cancellations or late starts, you must have a portal account through Infinite Campus.
- Parents and guardians with students in the district should have received an email from Infinite Campus with an activation link and activation code to set up a parent portal.

 If you have not received that email, please check first to see if the email was delivered to your spam/ junk mail folder. If you have not received an email, please contact your child's school office (Elementary – Carol Koestner at 573-782-4814. High School – Devona Maharas at 573-782-3313). If you do not have a child in the district and would like to receive notifications, please contact Kristen Heidbreder at kheidbreder@coler1indians.org and request an Infinite Campus portal account. To request an Infinite Campus portal account, you will need to provide the email address and cell phone number you want the notification to go to.

Important note: Parents and guardians must have a parent portal in Infinite Campus and opt into the service in order to receive district messages. We recommend that all parents and guardians check their contact preferences in Infinite Campus to ensure they receive messages through their preferred method. To check your preferences, log in to your parent portal and follow the steps below.

In the upper right-hand corner, click on the person icon. Select "settings".

- Site and Building planning to support a new athletic/activity building to the west of the high school and north of the football field
- Adding PreK classrooms to the Elementary School
