Priority Area 3: Funding and Facilities

Career Ladder Plan Approved for 2025–2026

The Board approved the 2025–2026 Career Ladder Plan, reinforcing our commitment to recognizing and rewarding the exceptional efforts of our certified staff.

Plan Highlights:

•Stage I (2 years): 50 hours = \$1,500

•Stage II (3 years): 75 hours = \$3,000

•Stage III (5 years): 100 hours = \$5,000

Gym Floor Replacement

Big news! The board approved a full replacement of the high school gym floor due to prior water damage. With major support from our insurance provider, MUSIC, the district will only cover a \$1,000 deductible—saving over \$33,000 compared to earlier sanding plans.

Timeline: The gym will be unavailable in July for construction.

Stellar Virtual Learning Partnership Approved

Starting 2025–2026, Cole County R-I will partner with Stellar Virtual Learning to serve non-resident students virtually. This will generate approximately \$200,000 in new revenue, helping support staff compensation and student resources without impacting local taxes or in-seat instruction.

Playground Project Underway

Thanks to the 2024 Scrap Tire Grant (\$40,000), we are moving forward with excavation and prep work on our lower elementary playground. This foundational work will enhance accessibility and safety for our youngest learners!

IMPORTANT REMINDERS from the Nurse Christie Murphy, RN

Following are some reminders for the 2025-2026 school year affecting certain grade levels and all students due to current Missouri state laws.

8th Grade: Tdap and MCV4 Vaccinations: Tdap (tetanus booster with pertussis) and MCV4 (Meningococcal in the form of Menactra or Menveo) vaccines are required for students enrolled in 8th grade. The deadline to submit proof of Tdap and MCV4 vaccines is the 1st day of school in August. If your child needs this immunization, contact your physician or clinic. Once he/she receives the Tdap and MCV4, please forward a copy of the official record from your health care provider to the school office. The vaccines may also be received at the Cole County Health Department. Bring your child's immunization record with you. For more information, their phone number is 573-636-2181.

12th Grade: MCV4 vaccinations (2 doses): Two doses of MCV4 (Meningococcal in the form of Menactra or Menveo) are required for students enrolled in 12th grade. If the first dose was administered at age 16 years or older, then only one dose is required. The deadline to submit proof of MCV4 vaccines is the 1st day of school in August.

<u>Kindergarten Immunizations:</u> A current and updated immunization record must be provided to the school before they can attend. The final set of vaccinations that Kindergarten enrollees must receive **after** their 4th birthday and before entering Kindergarten include: another Dtap, polio, a 2nd MMR, and a 2nd Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. If the child has had chickenpox disease, proof of disease must be provided in the form of a written statement signed by a physician documenting the month and year the child had chickenpox. Parental verification is not accepted. Immunizations can be obtained through the child's physician or by appt. at the Cole Co. Health Dept. For more information, call 573-636-2181.

<u>Preschool Immunizations:</u> A current and updated immunization record must be provided to the school before they can attend.

<u>District-wide Medication policy reminder for all grades:</u> Medication must be delivered to and picked up from school by a parent or designated adult. Long-term daily prescription medications given during school hours require a written physician authorization with pharmacy-labeled container. **New authorization is required for the new school year even if there was no change to your child's prescription.** If the dosage changes during the school year, an updated authorization is also required. Additional rules to the medication policy are in the school handbooks. For clarification, call Christie Murphy at 782-4814.

Student health history forms: In August, your child will bring home a new Student Health Information form. All students **must** return this form each school year. Please ensure that the pain reliever and cough drop permission line is marked according to your preference to be administered to your child as needed from the nurse's supply.

<u>Food substitutions:</u> If your child will require food substitutions due to a medically diagnosed condition, a specific form entitled "Medical Statement for Student Requiring Special Meals" will need to be completed by their physician. Copies of the form are available in the school nurse's office or on the school website. Note: *This form must be in place before dietary accommodations can be made.

<u>Nurse's section website:</u> Check out the **Nurse and Wellness** link on the school district website home page to find medication forms, health condition forms, and the food substitution form.

FACS Club

The FACS Club had the opportunity to tour Blooms & Blossoms Greenhouse on Curtman Road, not far from school, which is owned and operated by Sheila Thomas. After the tour, the students had a chance to create their own hanging arrangements with supervision on how much dirt, fertilizer, water, and flowers to use. They turned out beautiful!

Archery

The 2024-2025 archery season was a tremendous success, with many personal records set and perfect 50's shot. This season, we had 103 archers from 4th to 12th grade competing. Russellville Archery hosted two tournaments: bullseye and 3D, attracting multiple teams and hundreds of archers to our school. We also participated in tournaments at St. Martins, Helias, Capital City, Eldon, and Calvary Lutheran. A highlight was our Elementary team taking 1st overall at the Border Wars Tournament hosted at the Linc, earning a \$1500 cash prize for our program. We capped off the season by attending the State Tournament from March 20-22 in Branson, where five of our six teams finished in the top 10 in the state. Notably, Ethan Strobel and Grant Smith tied for 9th in the state in 3D out of 433 archers!
